KNOW YOUR FACTS

- Over **27 million people** are enslaved in the world today; 80% are women and children.
- The CIA estimates that, of the **3 million women and children** trafficked across borders each year, up to **20,000 enter the United States**. Another **2-4 million men, women, and children** are kidnapped and enslaved within their own countries.
- There have been reports of trafficking instances in **at least 20 different states, with most cases occurring in New York, California, and Florida**.
- The Immigration and Naturalization Service discovered **250 brothels in 26 different cities**; a large percentage of these women were likely trafficking victims.
